

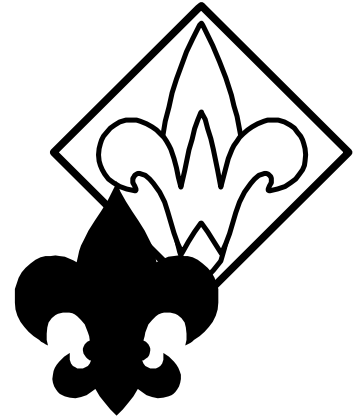

### **Campsite Judging**

This will be done during the day. Judging will be based on basic BSA policies related to neatness, cleanliness, and safety. Leave no trace should be practiced. Boy Scout Handbook or the Webelos handbook should be your guide. Campsite judging will be completed by the Area Directors. **See the Judging sheet included in this Handbook**

### **Campfire**

Every unit must be prepared with a skit, song or story. Not all will be used, however. Follow guidelines under **Extra Points** for submission of a skit, song, or story to the campfire coordination. **Dennis Kast** and the OA Chapter will run this event. A call-out ceremony will also be held by the Arrowhead OA Chapter. "Class A" Uniform required.

Saturday Night's Campfire is a group activity with skits, songs and fellowship for Boy Scouts, future scouts, family and friends. It is open to everyone who wishes to attend and share in the camaraderie.

**NOTE: In case of inclement weather the Campfire will be held under the headquarters Main Pavilion – Camporee/Weboree staff will announce.**

### **Extra points**

- Extra points for patrols and dens will be earned by their Troop or Pack's participation in the Dutch oven competition.
- Extra points will also be awarded for your unit's early registration (March 9th Roundtable), having every participant in "Class A" uniform at the Camporee/Weboree Opening Ceremony.
- An extra 10 points will be added to your patrols trail score when a campfire skit, song or story is submitted to the campfire coordinator Dennis Kast at [dkast@comcast.net](mailto:dkast@comcast.net) prior to the **Camporee/Weboree 2010 (i.e., by April 22, 2010)**

***Information:***

**1. Camporee Location**

This year's event will again be held at Camp Milldale 5425 Mt Gilead Rd Reisterstown, MD 21136

Each unit will have to carry the unit's gear and personal gear in and out of camp area. This includes units coming up early in the day to set up. No trailers will be allowed in campsites or driven down to the campsite to drop off gear.

**\*\*Reminder to all units NO Vehicles will be allowed beyond the STOP sign\*\***

**2. Directions (From Baltimore Beltway 695)**

- Take exit 19 for I-795/NW Expressway toward Owings Mills / Reisterstown
- Merge onto I-795 N **(8.3 Mi.)**
- Take exit 9A for MD-140 E/MD-30 N toward Hanover **(.4 Mi.)**
- Slight right at Butler Rd/MD-128 N **(.5 Mi.)**
- Turn left at Hanover Pike/MD-30 **(2.9 Mi.)**
- Turn left at Mt Gilead Rd follow to Camp Milldale entrance **(410 Ft.)**

**3. Registration, Registration Deadline and Camporee/Weboree patches  
(No exceptions)**

***Registration by March 9, 2010 at BAC Headquarters guarantees a patch at camp for unit attending after this date we will try to do our best to have a patch at camp  
Cut-off date to register for Camporee/Weboree is April 9, 2010.***

On Friday night April 23<sup>th</sup> all unit Troop leaders/Webelos leaders (Adults) must check-in at the Registrar's table at the main pavilion before being entering your campsite. All campsites will be assigned on a first received pre-registration basis.

**4. Area Directors**

Your area director's campsite will be clearly marked within your area site. Any questions, problems or concerns should be presented to your Area Director as soon as possible. He is your link to the staff please utilize him appropriately. The Area Directors will be judging the Campsites Saturday afternoon during the afternoon activities.

**5. Camp Set-Up (*All units will be camping in the field in their designated sites.*)**

Campsites will be inspected and judged for awards. All campsites should be set-up in a manner appropriate to Boy Scout set-up. If possible, tents should be uniform or at least pitched uniformly. Fire safety rules must be adhered to for **above ground fires**. If your unit will be using an ax or saw, you must have a visible "ax yard". **Only Troop Leaders, Boy Scouts and Adult helpers are allowed** in the ax yard. Kitchen areas should be clean and neat. Food must be stored properly. There should be a posted menu and duty roster in each troop/patrol/den site.

**With Dutch Oven cooking and above ground fires, there will be coals. All ashes, etc. must be thoroughly extinguished before disposal to avoid the possibility of a camp or dumpster fire!**

***GROUND FIRES ARE NOT ALLOWED!!***

**6. Competition and Trails**

This weekend is a competition to see how well the Boy Scouts in your unit and the Webelos in your Unit can work together to accomplish a goal. Their knowledge, skill and determination as a team will be put to the test. Most boys of all ages love competition; a lot actually thrive on it. Leaders need to prepare the boys on "how to follow natural leaders" according to their abilities (i.e. top knot tiers, fastest runners, most knowledge about first aid, etc.).

There will be several skill stations on the trail. All stations will not have a time limit; it is up to the boys to determine how long they want to spend at a station. Each station activity will be scored on competition, teamwork and scout spirit. Each patrol will have a scorecard to be completed and handed in at the close of the activities period (by around 4:30 PM Saturday). The intention of the competition is to encourage teamwork, scout spirit and to have the boys strive to Do Your Best and Be Prepared. Competition provides the additional incentive needed to do it right. For Boy Scouts this gives them the opportunity to improve their skills and to improve their teamwork.

***NOTE: All Webelos Dens must be split up into groups NO Larger than 10 boys!***

## 7. General Event Knowledge

- Make sure your Boy Scouts / Webelos plan and prepare for the weather. Class A uniforms on boys and leaders earn extra points at opening ceremony.
- **Bring your Troop flag Pack, and your Patrol / Den flags.**
- Tent buddies, or Sleeping arrangements should be assigned before you leave for the trip.
- First Aid stations will be clearly marked. Make sure you report all injuries to the First Aid station at once.
- **Taps are at 10:30 and Quiet time and lights out is 11:00 p.m.**
- No siblings under the age of 16 can spend the night, unless they are affiliated with a Cub, Troop or Venture Crew unit and a registered participant for this event
- **No PETS at this event**
- **Patrols or Webelos Dens participating in the competition cannot exceed 10 boys.**

## 8. Departure and Checkout

Departure will take place after closing ceremonies and once your area director has inspected your campsite. **Each unit will be assigned a departure time in 15 minute intervals.**

### ***Remember***

***"Scouts always leave the area the same or in better condition than they found it."***  
*Leave no trace. That means gateways must be disassembled and materials redistributed in the woods. No visible trash, no damage to the environment. All trash must be carried out of the camporee site (Camp Milldale) home with the unit.*

*Once the area director gives you your departure pass, the unit leader can obtain the ribbons, etc at the registrar's table as you leave. Have a safe trip home.*
