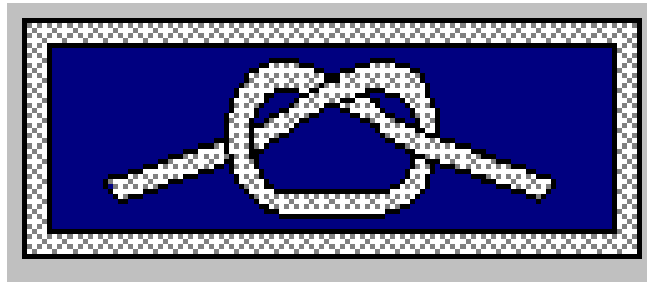

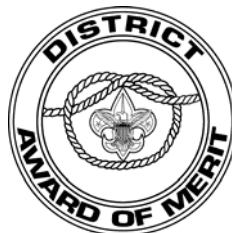

He has unselfishly performed all of these roles with the result of guaranteeing the success of the Scouting program.

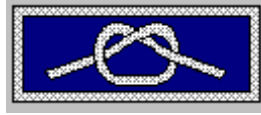
He has also been a positive and effective role model for us the parents, in his example and temperament in working with these young people.
